The Rotary Club of Norfolk Sunrise presented \$5,000.00 to the Norfolk General Hospital Foundation in support of the Year of the Cat 2.0 Campaign. On Wednesday October 16, Helga Stuermer RCNS Community Service Committee member delivered the generous donation to Jennifer White NGH Foundation Director which will help fund the purchase of a new Computed Tomography (CT) unit.

"We are happy to be able to support the needs of our community. The Cat Scan Campaign is a great cause to which our club is pleased to support" remarked Stuermer.

The CT is the single most important diagnostic tool at NGH. The new unit will produce sharper, clearer images creating easier to read scans while providing greater patient safety.
